Tom was born in Detroit and graduated from Cooley High School in 1958. He attended Lawrence Institute of Technology, where he was a member of the Phi Kappa Upsilon fraternity. Tom served in the U.S. Army from September of 1963 until September of 1965 with a tour of duty in Germany. He was employed at Ford Motor Co. more than 55 years, retiring in 2018 at the age of 78. He was a materials engineer at Ford's Central Lab in Dearborn and was a member of UAW Local 1970. He was active in the Gaelic League of Detroit Irish American Club and in planning the city's annual St. Patrick's Day Parade. He was a member of St. John the Baptist Ukrainian Catholic Church in Detroit and also attended daily Mass at National Shrine of the Little Flower Basilica in Royal Oak, where was a member of several prayer groups.
