Andrew Robert Forsyth (51) of Westland, Michigan passed away suddenly on April 1, 2024 after a short illness. Andy was born on June 23rd, 1972 in Columbus, Indiana and was adopted by Edward and Nancy Forsyth. Born with special needs, Andy could not sit upright until he was 12 months old, and it was predicted he would be blind his entire life. Andy overcame these obstacles, and with his trusty glasses, he was always reading anything he could find. Andy loved participating in the Special Olympics: he was especially excited when he was able to run in the track and field events. He also enjoyed talking to others and telling them about the weather or his favorite sport team, the Detroit Pistons. One of his favorite artists was Bon Jovi, but he loved all music! During the summers he would enjoy swimming in the family pool and helping his father in the garden. One of his favorite activities was bowling, and he also loved going to church with his mother and father. Andy loved celebrating his birthday, especially surrounded by his nieces and nephews, who he referred to as his “best friends”. Andy’s father passed away April 1st, and Andy followed his dad into heaven four hours later. Andy is survived by his mother Nancy, and his siblings Kristofer (Kristin) Forsyth and Robin (Joshua) Weller. Andy’s family will be having a memorial service at First Presbyterian Church in Plymouth, Michigan, on Saturday, April 6th. Visitation will be at the church from 10-12 pm.
