Arline and Bill retired in Frankfort, MI and wintered in Punta Gorda FL until his death in 1995. Arline was a homemaker and loved to cook and entertain. She loved family gatherings and will be remembered for her turkey dinners, potato salad and apple pies. Arline returned to Plymouth in 1997 where she made new friends and enjoyed living in the Bradbury Park Condo Community. During the past 2 years she resided in Union Court Assisted Living in St. Charles MI, Ashley Nursing Care Center, Ashley MI and Cameo House in Coopersville, MI. She will be fondly remembered by all as the life of the party and the bell of the ball.
