“ He served Detroit as a policeman till 1975, was there during the riots saving people and getting them to safety, he comforted the homeless when it got cold by taking them in for the night in a holding cell for dinner and a warm breakfast in the morning before being released. Giving blankets out that he bought when he could afford them on his meager policeman's salary. After he got injured and left medically retired, he ran and got elected as a Wayne county commissioner. One of the items he voted for was the phone call box system installed during the height of I94 attacks on drivers in the Detroit section so they could call for assistance in the rougher area of Detroit. It was during this era he started the Palm Sunday visits to the veterans hospital near Grand Rapids to help the veterans with socks, underwear, toiletries, a small band for music, and bingo. Many of the prizes that were given came from his successful home business called "Clem's Place" - belt buckles, belts, hats, all had the Polish eagle - showing the pride in Polish heritage of giving. The PLAV post 169 group has made this trip with Clem for 47 years, Clem missed the last 2, but his donations still made it to the veterans. When Casmir Ogonowski was removed from office, who was working on the Magnum oil issue, Clem ran to replace him. He won with the absentee vote, forms that he made available during his campaigning at senior centers and hospitals who wanted them. As a State Representative for the people of Wayne County,he stood up and voted for the Grand jury investigation into the Magnum oil scandal but it cost him his seat in the house due to the politics at the time. He then was appointed to the Wayne County Soldiers Relief Fund where he assisted veterans and provided the relief to the families of Wayne County that lost their veteran spouses and could not afford to bury them with dignity. He served without recognition, that was not his thing. I would like him remembered for his caring, his being a dad, a mentor, his "Peace be with you" attitude. We love him and miss him.
