October 15, 1951 - April 13, 2026

Deborah Pratt Maloni of Plymouth Michigan was born on October 15, 1951 in Bloomington Indiana. After dealing with a sudden onset of serious health issues since January 2026, she contracted pneumonia and since her immune system was compromised, she passed away suddenly from Sepsis on April 13, 2026 in Sarasota Florida.

Beloved wife of Raymond Maloni (for 53 years), she is survived by her brother David Pratt (wife Kathy), her son Anthony Maloni (wife Gabriella), Daughter Katherine Memisevic (husband Emir), and her four Grandchildren, Macie and Michaela Maloni, and Aiden and Leo Memisevic.

After graduating from Indiana University with a Bachelors in Education degree, she taught elementary school in the Lafayette Indiana school system while Ray was finishing his education at Purdue. After receiving her Masters Degree from Purdue and after Ray graduated, they moved to Plymouth Michigan where she taught elementary school in the Plymouth/Canton school system for 37 years.

Not only did she positively impact well over 1,000 young people through her teaching; she was also very active in the Plymouth Community. She was one of the original members of Save the Penn/Friends of the Penn Theater organization, a founding member of Giving Hope/Womans' Giving Circle, and

very active in Delta Kappa Gamma.

She was also very involved in the Longboat Key Florida Whitney Beach Condo Association community; Party Planning Committee Chair, WBA Book Club Founder and President, and Social Committee organizer. She loved her time spent on the beach in Longboat Key Florida and sitting on the dock at the family lake cottage in Nobleboro Maine.
