Gerry received her BA from Marygrove College, her MA from Wayne University and her PhD from U of M. She was a professor at U of M in Special Education with an emphasis on the education of the blind. She traveled extensively for the Department of Health Education and Welfare, studying education of children and youth. Gerry was a prolific author of books and articles. In 1985 she was awarded the prestigious Migel Medal by the American Foundation for the Blind, a medal she wore with great pride. She was a member and generous benefactor of Old St. Patrick Church in Whitmore Lake for most of her adult life. She always had at least two dogs. Gerry was a longtime member and officer of the Ann Arbor Dog Club, through which she gave classes in obedience training. The family will gather with friends Saturday, October 30 at 9:30 AM until the 10 AM memorial service at Our Lady of Victory Church, 133 Orchard Drive (Main Street at Orchard), Northville.
