January 4, 1916 - June 1, 2009

After high school Helen attended nursing school in Sioux City, Iowa for three years and graduated as a registered nurse. She then moved to Detroit, Michigan where she was a surgical nurse at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Detroit. It was there that she met her future husband, Victor Kozian. Helen and Victor were married on December 28, 1940 and they spent 64 wonderful years together before Victor's death on December 10, 2004.

Their life was blessed with three children; Clifton (Rose Ann), Philip (Maureen), and Donna and they were the proud grandparents of Lisa M. Kozian. Helen worked primarily as a homemaker in their Detroit home. She was very active member of St. Christopher parish and was very involved in the Rosary Altar Society, Brownies, and Scouts. She loved decorating and craft work. Her artistic talents often displayed themselves in the form of very special Christmas gifts and in many church function decorations. Helen's comforting and caring nature provided a wonderful home life for her husband,
