He and his sister Danielle shared an especially strong bond, often calling each other twin, despite being two years apart, and getting each other going with their signature back-and-forth laughter that could stretch on.

James was a natural jokester who also found joy in life's simplest pleasures. He loved mowing the lawn and would proudly show Caitlin his freshly cut handiwork like a kid at show and tell. One of Caitlin's most cherished memories is from the early days of their relationship, when James secretly flew back to Florida from Michigan, hid inside a box, and jumped out to surprise her—a grand, romantic gesture that perfectly captured his playful and loving spirit.

James and Caitlin were married on October 22, 2022, eager and excited to build a life together.

He was also a proud and loving uncle to his nephew, Del, and the two shared a special connection through their mutual love of trains. Whether discussing their favorites or playing together, James made sure every moment with Del was filled with joy, curiosity, and imagination. He also cherished spending time with his brother, Zack, whether talking for hours or hanging out with him and Del, enjoying activities together, and creating lasting memories.

Professionally, James worked as a service technician at Carlo and Sons Trucking. He was known not just for his dedication and strong work ethic, but also for his playful energy—he kept a Super Soaker and cans of silly string tucked in his toolbox, ready to prank unsuspecting coworkers at any time. James had a soft spot for animals, especially his beloved rescue dog, Reef. She was more than a pet—she was his constant companion. It wasn't uncommon to find the two napping side by side or sharing a slice of pizza. A true lover of the outdoors, James especially treasured his time at the lake. Growing up on Portage Lake—where his grandmother, Mytie Coleman, lived until her passing in 2010—he made some of his happiest memories. He could swim for hours on end, and those closest to him joked that he must've been part fish. The water brought him peace and joy, and he never passed up a summer day at the lake. He especially loved spending time with his family out on his dad's boat, soaking in the sun and feeling the wind rush from tubing, surrounded by laughter and love.

James also loved venturing to Michigan's Upper Peninsula, where he and his mom enjoyed rock hunting, sharing a quiet, meaningful time they both cherished. Summers were also spent with his grandparents, Doris and Eugene Umlor, along with his brother Zack and sister Danielle. Together they went on "mystery trips" and biked all over their neighborhood.

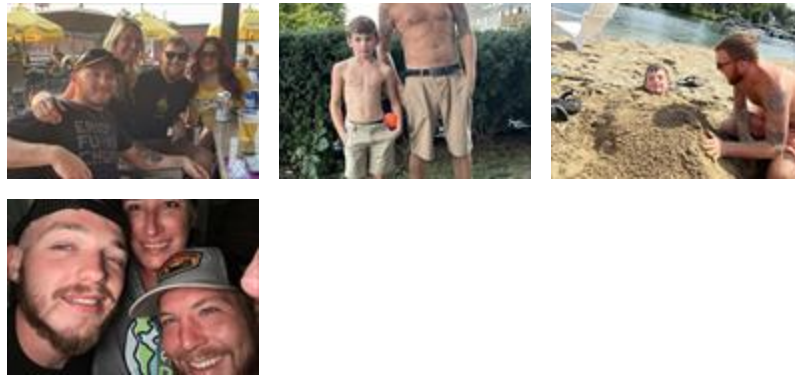
