I didn't understand all the particulars. I just recognized that John was a loving and concerned father who had the best interest of his two young sons in his heart, and that he was working hard to keep on keeping on. -- In my young adult years I recall Uncle John sharing reports on the Great Lakes with my parents, and that he arranged for his colleagues to stay in Springfield to gather data from Lake Erie for the research they were doing. I thought his profession was impressive and intriguing. In fact, in my early undergraduate years I took Intro to Geology as an elective, and I liked it so much that I also went on to take a new higher level course offering, Historical Geology, and I aced them both.
