“ Kevin,

I don't know where to begin as we had so many classic times together. It all started on a hot summers day in July of 1975 when I met you for the first time in front of your house on Kingsway.

In the 70s we had play production with me on stage and you in the orchestra. Playing ping pong for hours in your basement. Working the night shift at Larry's Standard. Fishing every cove and canal of Duck Lake. I still have the prom pictures taken of our group at your house. Roasting a pig the night before your graduation party. Sneaking my dads Chevette and practicing driving a stick shift for hours. Along the way we got in all kinds of trouble that was such a big deal then but seems so funny now.

In the 80s you talked me into going to Grand Valley State. I finally enrolled and moved into the dorm only to have you quit a month later. Even that is funny now. Our fishing got more serious. The tackle boxes got bigger and we fished places like Tipsico Lake, Whitmore Lake, Saginaw Bay and Lake St. Claire. My grandfather would join us once a year when he came through town and my grandparents always looked forward to seeing you. When I worked at the Deli at 12 Oaks you would always come around because I would make you a 1 lb corned beef sandwich. In 1986 I left Michigan for good but we always kept in touch when I came back. We would have a blast out on Wardlow field with my brother and his illegal fireworks. We would play the ponies at Northville Downs.

For most of the 90s we went to the Lions game every Thanksgiving day. You were at my brothers wedding and in 2009 you were at my wedding. History will note that at the reception line when you came up I called the photographer over to get a picture of you and I because you meant that much to me. That is the picture of you that is posted here on the tribute wall.

Whenever you showed up anywhere it turned whatever was going

on into a party. I will never forget your raucous laugh and how you drawled out my name so it sounded like my grandfather. Our birthdays are 4 days apart and for 40 years you called me on July 31st and I called you on August 4th. I still remember how much we laughed just 2 months ago. I will miss you terribly and take comfort that we will have more chapters in another place.
