Hartz, Paul E. 81 of Tionesta, Pennsylvania died May 14, 2012 at Angela Hospice in Livonia, Michigan after a long battle with general medical problems but ended his life with kidney disease. Born August 28, 1930 in Mt. Oliver, Pennsylvania, he was the son of the late Edward and Irene Hartz. Mr. Hartz attended St. Joseph High School. He was a veteran of the Korean War, having served in the U.S. Marines. He retired from Stone & Webster Engineering Company in 1986 as a Quality Control Engineer.
