“ I spent part of last year asking my mom, Reggie Anderson, questions about her life and recording her answers. One question was how she met Phil. This was her answer:

I can't remember when I first met Phil. But he would walk me to my classes and visit me at my locker. He would put his hand on my neck in an affectionate way but a teacher and Paul (another guy who had a crush on mom) told him to knock it off. Phil was in the same grade at school, but I can't remember if we were in the same classes or not, I took college prep classes. Phil was in all the sports. I remember he was always a good-looking kid, and he was on all the teams so I thought that was very cool. I didn't go to the Friday night dances very many times, because I was nervous I didn't know how the kids danced or knew the dances they would do.

When I met Phil again in Florida, it was because we had been talking on the phone for quite a long time before we actually saw each other. Phil's wife, Olga had passed away about 3 years before we saw each other, and Daddy had been gone for about 7 years. Olga was Phil's sister-in-law. When his brother passed away, Phil married Olga and became a stepdad to his nieces and nephews. Phil was up in the Sarasota area, in Florida 2020, and Covid had already started and he came down to Englewood because I was with Lisa and Robin. After visiting at Lisa's for a while (a handful of days, rides, going out...) we went away for the weekend and Robin was upset because she couldn't get in touch with us. I came back home with Robin to Garden City in May, and Phil had to come home because of his health. It was very nerve-racking flying home in the midst of Covid. Phil and I started spending time together as soon as I came home. When I arrived at his house- because he said-"bring your clothes and just stay", - he about had a heart attack when he saw how many clothes I brought. I am very happy with Phil. He had a very happy relationship before, and his step-kids love him, and that is so important to me. I love Phil. He is very kind and loving to me. I try to pitch in on whatever we spend money on. I feel better knowing I've contributed. We get along really well. We are happy.
