“ I knew Dick, aka, Dr Browne, aka Brownie as a professional colleague for many years. For those of you who didn't know him in that capacity, he was quite a remarkable professional. Some of his basic background is as follows:

Profession: Physician

Specialty: Radiology

Sub-specialty: Coronary Angiography

Practice Group: Associated Radiologists of Oakland County (AROC)

Hospital: St Joseph's in Pontiac (now St Joe's Oakland)

Med School: Wayne State

Undergrad: Lawrence Tech (never finished his bachelor's degree)

Residency: Several Metro Detroit Hospitals (mostly Providence)

Medical Approach: Minimalist

Motto: Attention to Detail Leads to Success

Notable Items:

- *Never earned a bachelor's degree but was smart enough to get into medical school*
- *Started med school older than most – about age 30*
- *Reportedly did most of his studying at the original Buddy's pizza with a cold beer in hand*
- *Served as the financial leader for his medical group, AROC*
- *Was a pioneer in charity care financial policies – his policy was if a patient is willing to pay at least one dollar per month of their debt, they will never go to collections*
- *Was a pioneer in the idea of 'physicians as executive leaders' – he was the first VPMA in what is now Trinity Health, one of the largest health systems in the nation*
- *Leadership style – quiet, focused, disciplined, let his actions speak for him*
- *Despised arrogance, especially in physicians*
- *Felt you should always treat staff well, they are part of the team*
- *Claims to have been told by a judge in court while on the witness stand to stop intimidating the plaintiff's attorney*
- *Only sued once in his career, in a case that he was not directly involved in*

- *Decried the greed of physicians as the issue that would destroy the profession, encouraged docs to join together in negotiations and go directly to purchasers bypassing payers (perhaps a nod to the collective bargaining approach of his days as a Teamster)*
 - *Strong dislike of meetings – claims to have invented the five minute meeting which is how he ran meetings when he was the chair*
 - *Was once called at home by the head of medical transcription department who was concerned that he might not know how to use the dictation equipment because his reports were so short, he kindly replied that he said everything he had to say in as few words as possible and everything was working just fine*
 - *When the Pope was in Pontiac MI, St Joe's was designated as the trauma center and Dick was designate as the lead radiologist, he spent the afternoon at home 45 miles away commenting that the Pope's destiny was in God's hands not any doctor's*
 - *During his career he had opportunities to move and practice in Arizona and Northern MI but he chose to stay and serve the needs of Pontiac, MI (a pretty rough community)*
 - *Ultimately he stopped practicing medicine because he could no longer tolerate bad attitudes of physician colleagues in his group*
 - *I'm told while he practiced his home was filled with medical journals that he was constantly reading to make sure he was keeping up with the latest advancements in his field*
 - *While doing all of the above he raised nine kids. I don't think he was able to spend as much time with them as he wanted when they were young but he sure spent plenty of time with them when they were grown and he was retired*
 - *And I don't think he ever forgot flowers for this wife on their anniversary or her birthday*
 - *In fact, for many years he made a point to spend one afternoon a week with his wife, often at the Fischer Theater in Detroit*
- Sure, he had his flaws. He pissed some people off along the way and probably made some errors in judgement but, who hasn't. As I noted at the start, he was quite a remarkable man. The world will miss him but the world is a better place because he lived.*
