*The first time I met Bob Wyatt, I was amazed at his story of a program he was running at Roush in which he was hiring transition students (HS students who need more support who typically earn a certificate of completion at the age of 26) and other adults with disabilities for jobs there. He appropriately altered the interview process for them so he could properly get a gauge of their strengths and abilities to match them up with roles at Roush. In one case when an employee did not work out, he did not let them go but rather met with them and their manager to identify why it happened and was then able to reassign the employee to a different role that they were then successful in. He selflessly did this with no fanfare. The Living and Learning Enrichment Center and its Exceptional Academy were preparing to partner with him in an effort to get even more people into quality jobs at Roush. My plan was to share his story to inspire other HR professionals at Detroit SHRM as his energy was infectious. Imagine my shock when I learned that he was eagerly accomplishing all of this while in the middle of a battle with Stage IV cancer. You would never know it though because he ALWAYS had a smile on his face and in his heart that was clearly visible in person and that you could hear in his voice in conversations over the phone, including one in which he answered my call which I unknowingly dialed while he was in the middle of treatment at the hospital - NOTHING seemed to phase this man. Bob succumbed to his battle last weekend and leaves a great legacy which would be a shame to end with his passing. He and I were eager to see the next generation of HR professionals who would continue his legacy and convince their companies to run similar programs to further the progress of evaluation and employment for adults with disabilities. This may very well be the only thing to allow him to rest in peace. Thank you, Bob, for an inspiring life well-lived!*
