



## Rodney Lane Rickard

Rodney L. Rickard, age 85, of Canton, Michigan, passed away peacefully on April 15, 2026.

Born on October 15, 1940, in Florence, Alabama, Rodney was the son of the late Henry and the late Ruby Rickard. He grew up with a deep appreciation for hard work, education, and family—values that remained at the core of his life. Rodney attended Redford High School before continuing his education at Harding University, where he earned his bachelor's degree. He later received his master's degree from Western Michigan University and went on to earn his Ph.D. from Detroit College of Law, reflecting his lifelong dedication to learning and personal growth.
