Salome Anne Humphries was born in Harbor Beach, Michigan on July 21, 1922 and passed away peacefully at her home in Plymouth, Michigan on September 5, 2018.

A self-described city girl at heart, Anne moved to Detroit and enjoyed her longtime employment at Burroughs Corporation while raising her family in the western suburbs. Anne loved spending time with her children, particularly long lunches with her “girls.” She had a special heart for babies, who were as fond of her as she was of them, and cherished time with her grandchildren throughout her life. Anne also enjoyed visiting with friends; was a lifelong walker; reading two papers a day as well as books; and, in good seasons and bad, cheering on the Detroit Tigers, even receiving a Happy Birthday wish on the scoreboard at Comerica Park for her 80th. A funeral
