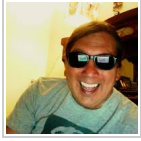
She will be remembered for her kindness, laughter, and the light she brought to those around her. Though her time with us was far too short, her legacy of love and care will continue in the lives she touched.

A private service will be held for family and close friends. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to organizations supporting children with autism or animal welfare, causes close to Stefanie's heart.

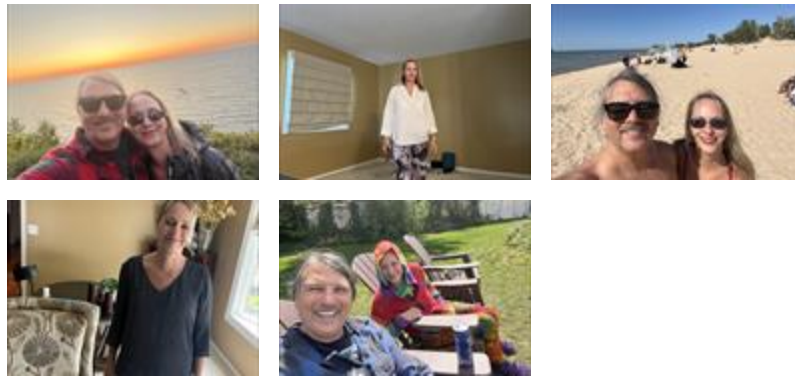

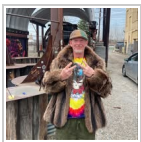
Tribute Wall
