I bet there is a poker game getting larger and larger each year up in heaven. I know my mom and especially my dad will be waiting for Uncle Ted with open arms. There is one more thing I must mention is how much I admire both Uncle Ted and Aunt Dee for raising a family that truly loved each other deeply. They always had each other's backs and while they were together you could see the love and true fun they always shared with one another. That seems a

feat to be very difficult to accomplish these days but they hit the nail on the head when it came to raising their family. I Miss you Uncle Ted and leave you with all my love. You will be greatly missed but dearly remembered until we meet again.
